This Week with Mrs. Kelly

A representative from Seedlings Braille Books for Children, a Livonia non-profit, presented to each grade during SEL this week. Students learned what Braille is and how people who are blind and have visual impairments read. They had the opportunity to feel Braille books and wrote their names in Braille. Braille books are very expensive. If you were to purchase Charlotte's Web, in paperback it would cost about \$6, in Braille it would cost about \$150! Seedlings provides free and lowcost Braille books to children with vision loss around the world. Students also learned about the "Power of One" and how one person, such as the founder of Seedlings, can make such a big difference in the lives of so many people. For the month of March, each classroom has a jar where students can donate coins to support Seedlings. \$10 in donations = 1 Braille book

STAR Scores from Winter 2025

Scaled Score: Ranges from 0-1400 and spans grades 1-12. It is calculated based on the difficulty of the questions and the number of correct responses. Scaled Score is useful for comparing student performance over time and across grades.

Individual STAR reports will be sent out with third quarter report cards.

Grade Equivalent: Represents how a student's test performance compares with that of other students nationally. For example, if the GE is 5.2, that means this student scores the same as an average fifth grade in the second month, NOT that they can complete fifth-grade level material.

Percentile Rank: Scores range from 1-99 and express student ability relative to the scores of other students in the same grade nationally. For example, if the percentile rank is 75, the student's skills are greater than 75% of other children in the same grade that scored similarly nationwide.

Instructional Reading Level: A criterion-referenced score that is the highest reading level at which a student is 80% proficient or higher at comprehending material with assistance.

First grade math STAR requires a good amount of reading. Therefore, if a child is not a fluent reader, their math scores will be lower. First graders are at different developmental stages and make tremendous growth throughout the year.



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
