Both SEPA and School Committee members are staying on board for the 2025-26 school year. Therefore, there will not be applications going out for open positions at this time.

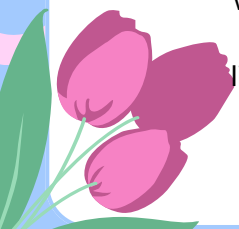

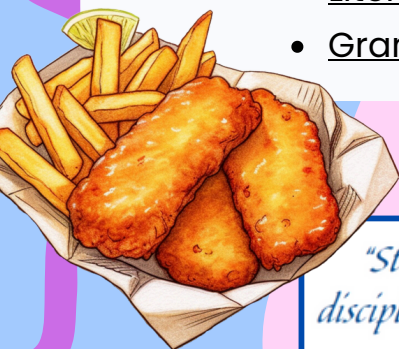

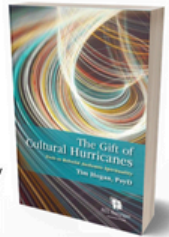
